



Motiva Enterprises donated land at the Bushwick Inlet to The Greenpoint Monitor Museum. The Museum received a GCEF Grant to develop an ecological design for shoreline restoration and stabilization at the future site of the Museum building, raise the land for flood protection, and provide community access. The engineering firm AECOM prepared conceptual drawings pro bono to assist in securing the grant. Through grant funds AECOM has undertaken site exploration to update its shoreline restoration design and at this time is awaiting DEC and USACE permit approval while preparing construction documents.
